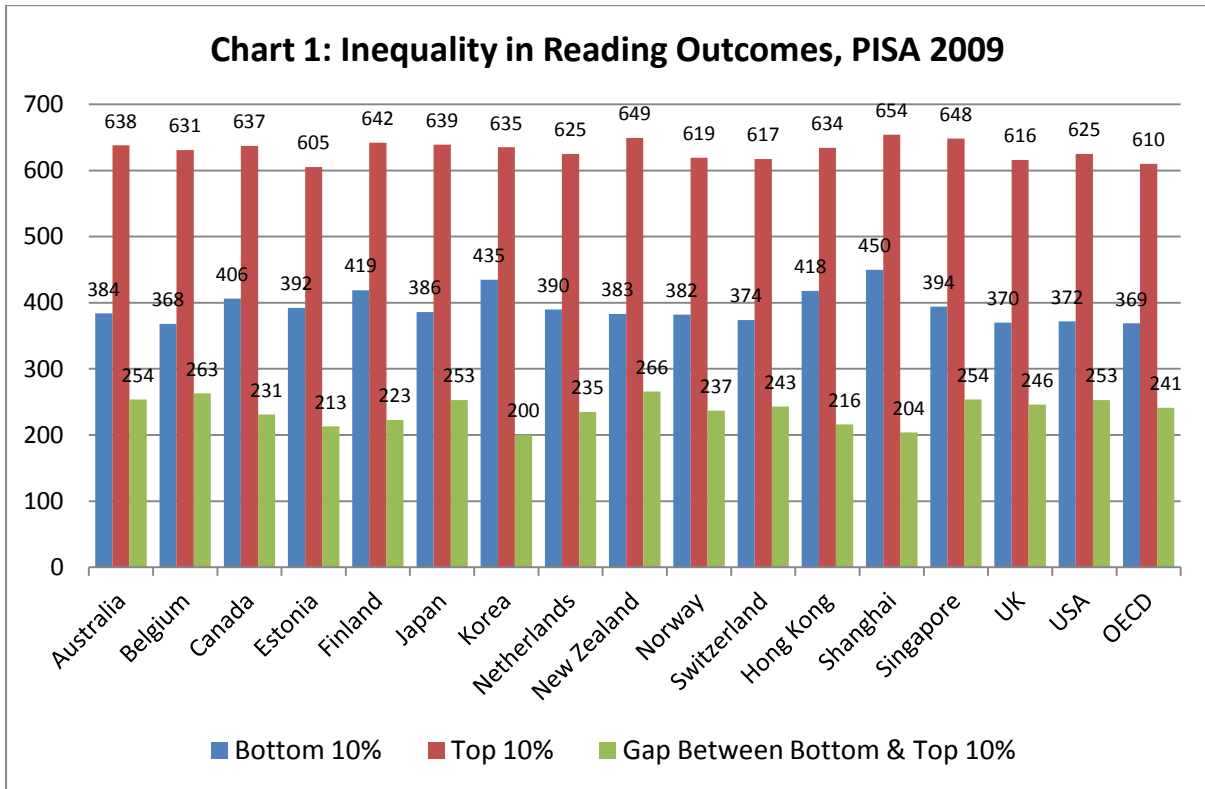
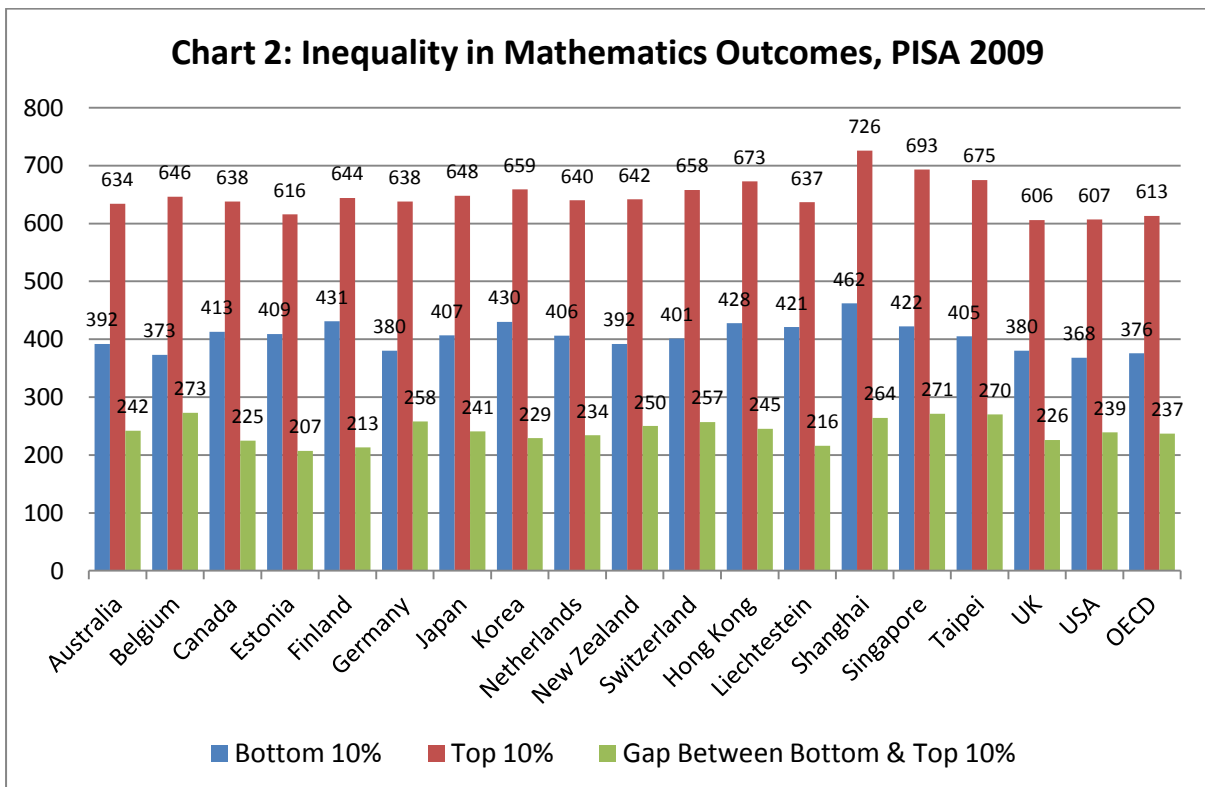

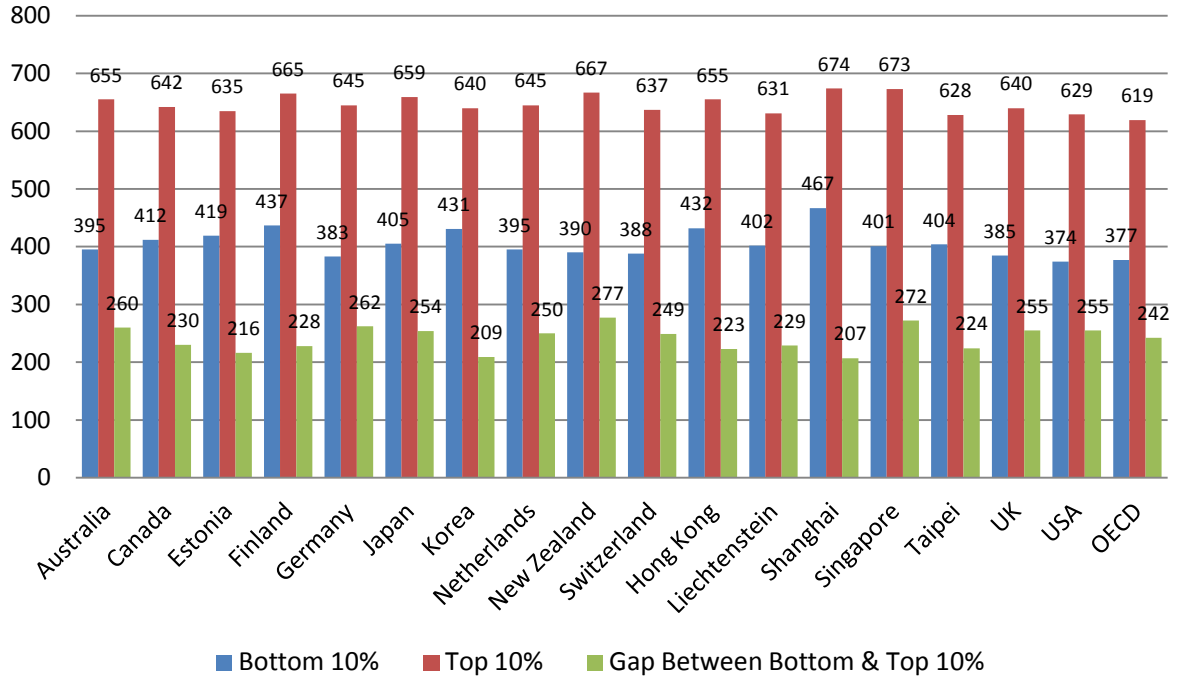

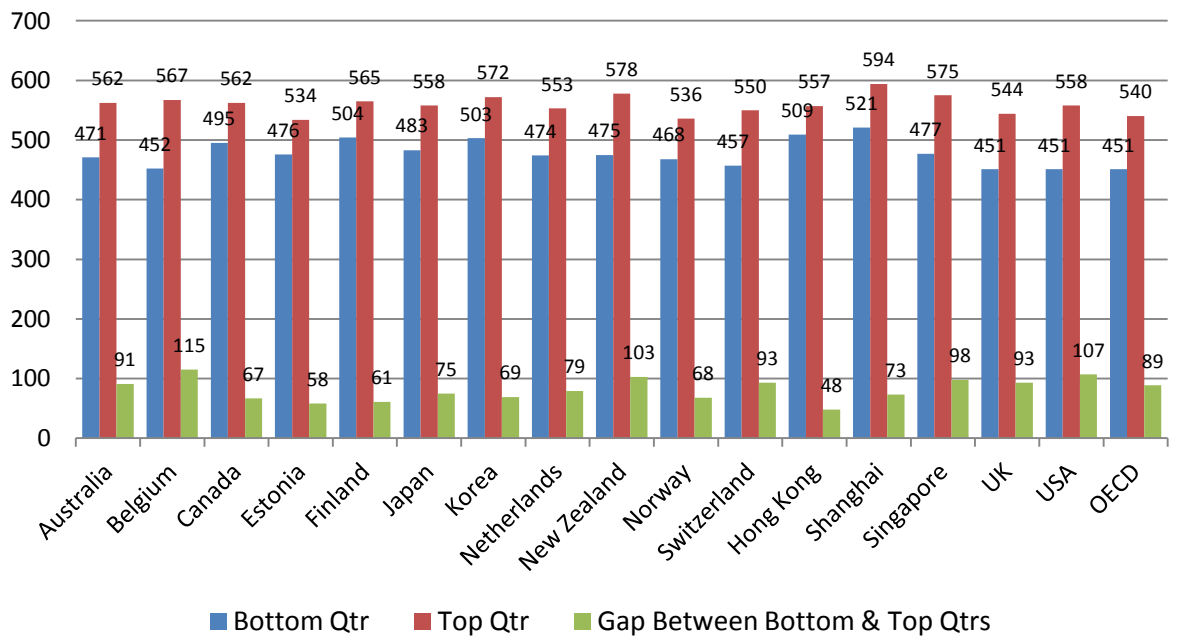

Chart 3: Inequality in Science Outcomes, PISA 2009



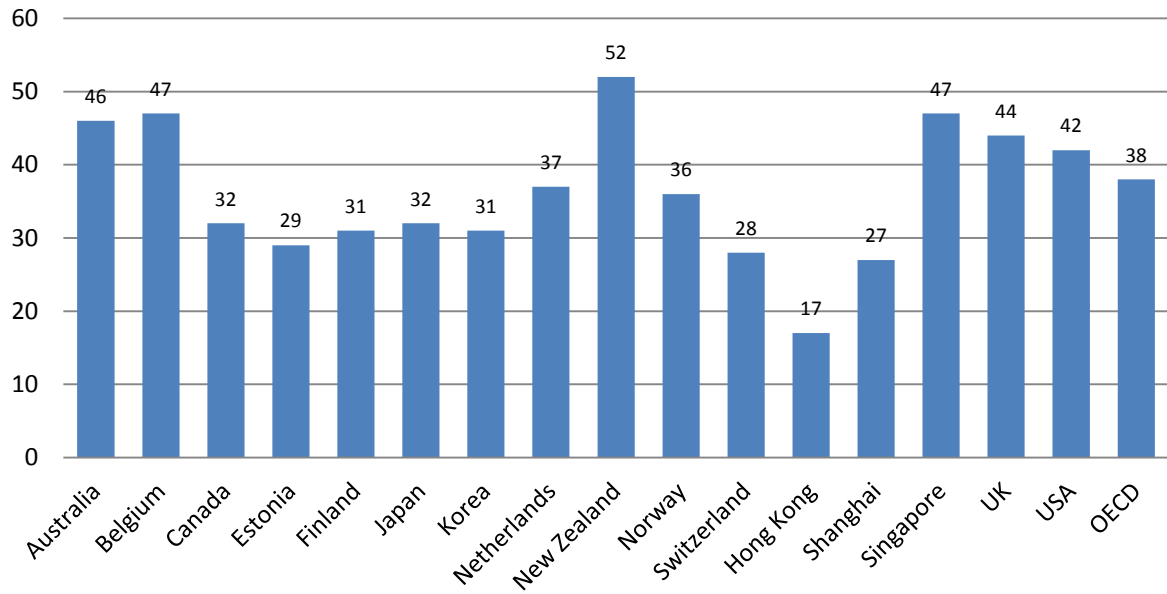
